At Key Stage 4 (Years 10 and 11) students are offered a broad curriculum in which they are also able to select a chosen pathway. During the options process students are individually guided to select appropriate study based upon their Post 16 preferences, personal areas of interest and a balanced academic and vocational (personalised) pathway.

We review our subject offer at Key Stage 4 annually to ensure that students are offered a broad and balanced curriculum on relevant and current courses. We work closely with the Cabot Learning Federation (and wider research) to ensure that we are offering the best courses for our students. Students are encouraged to select options that they will enjoy, be successful at and, although not in all cases, will lead onto the next stage of education.

Students choose options at the end of Year 9, commencing them at the start of year 10. All students choose 4 options, and have 3 50-minute lessons per week on each. Those students that select Triple Science have extra Period 7 lessons, which they buy into at the start of the course. The options currently available are:
